Dear Friends,

Obviously the Coronavirus has turned our world upside down and the world of the church is no different. Houses of worship have had to shut down and/or seriously alter many regular operations. Here at Vance Memorial Presbyterian Church we now distribute bulletins differently, take up an offering differently, and pass the peace differently but the question we have been wrestling with for several months now is how do we celebrate the Lord's Supper differently if at all.

After much soul searching the Worship and Music Commission of this congregation along with me, the pastor, have decided several things are helpful in answering this quandary: the first of which is the May sermon series I have been preaching here at Vance has been all about the Lord's Supper. While these may not have been the best homiletical pieces in all of Christendom, I do think they have been serious educational aids as we seek to be both practical and theologically upright.

In *Dining with Jesus: Community* we considered the assertion that in Reformed theological tradition sacraments must be done in community and we examined the question of whether or not a virtual community is indeed a community. Having answered in the affirmative, we then turned our attention to the different modes and meanings communion has in various religious traditions landing ourselves in the Reformed understanding that in the Sacrament Jesus is really but spiritually present to the church.

We then focused on the meaning of the meal attentive to the common understanding that the sacrament is a memorial meal in which we remember the gracious acts of our Lord. However Holy Communion is far more than just a remembrance; it is also a celebration of the coming together of God's people in sacrifice and praise and it does so in anticipation of a joyful feast in glory with Jesus as the Host. So that brings us to the final week of the sermon series as we prepare to receive the Sacrament on the first Sunday of the month.

First we must understand that preparation has always been stressed in the Reformed theological understanding of the Lord's Supper. Worshippers are continually reminded that BEFORE we approach the table we are to prepare our hearts by examining our relationship with Jesus and with others as we consider the need for the forgiveness of sins. Now in the midst of a pandemic we simply must prepare more than spiritually but also physically and practically.

Before worship on June 7th (and beyond) take the time to not only prepare your hearts but also your homes for the Sacrament. Do so with the attention to detail that says "Jesus is coming to my home." Set your table. Consider the elements you will use and also the dishware that will hold them. And join with the community in person, on the radio, or via video in celebrating the Lord's presence in our midst. In this way together we will uphold the theological integrity of the Sacrament while remaining practical.


Because our church was separated for safety, the children sent selfportraits to Vance friends to bring them cheer and the love of God! The recipients LOVED them!

Bibles for Graduates




