Fall Creativity

School is now in full swing, both at the university campuses and at our home for virtual elementary and middle school. Lydia and Elena have adjusted as well as we could have hoped to the online format for third and sixth grade at Kirkbride School. Aslan started Kindergarten a few weeks after the girls, as he is attending Philadelphia Performing Arts Charter School (a free public school by lottery process rather than neighborhood delineation). He is in a virtual classroom with a regular education teacher as well as a special education teacher. This school has provided lots of intervention and support for him and we have been pleased with his progress even though it is difficult to juggle helping him on Zoom calls while also working from home.

This year has proved to be challenging as campus ministers. The only campus that began the year inperson quickly switched to a virtual format after several hundred cases of Covid-19 popped up among college students. We are now spending most of our days in Zoom meetings, but God is still at work. We are trying unique outreaches on Temple's campus as students continue to study outdoors, while discipleship and large group meetings happen on the computer.

Our efforts at community care and education continue in our neighborhood. We will begin an inperson tutoring program for kids in Kindergarten through sixth grade at our church building on October 5. God has already raised up over 20 volunteers for this vital support of our most vulnerable neighborhood kids who are learning English as their second language. We are grateful to be able to serve in this capacity alongside our role as campus ministers and pray often to be a light in the areas to which God has called us.
